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**Examples:**

Do you speak English?

Yes, a little.

Yes, I speak English.

No, I don't speak English.

I don't speak much English, but I'm learning it.

Your English is good.

Your speak English well / very well.

Ali is a good boy.

They live in a good house.

This is not a good place live in.

Reza behaves well.

She sings really well.

Mina is a good girl.

She speaks English well.

Your English is getting better.

Your English is much better now.

Does your brother / sister / father / mother / friend / wife / husband  
speak English?

Does Ali speak English?

Does your brother speak English well?

You speak English.

Do you speak English?

You don't speak English.

He speaks English.

Does he speak English?

He doesn't speak English / Persian.

Excuse me, does anyone here speak English?

How well do you know English?

How well does she / he / Ahmad know English?

Do you speak it perfectly / fluently?

Do you speak English perfectly / fluently?

I speak English pretty well / very well / extremely well / exceptionally well.

Does your brother speak English well?

Yes, he speaks English pretty well.

Does your sister speak English well?

Yes, she speaks English very well.

Does your friend John speak English very well?

Yes, he speaks English pretty well.

No, he doesn't speak English well.
